Executive Director's Report

The 2022/23 fiscal year brought opportunities for new growth for Chilliwack Hospice Society and the Thrifty Boutique, and our staff, with the support of an incredible Board of Directors, were ready to meet the challenge.

We continued to see an increase in the need for grief support for bereaved adults and youth in our community and sought to diversify our programming to offer specific support for displaced Ukrainians, pre-teens and teens, and those grieving the loss of beloved pet or an adult sibling.

Our compassionate Client & Patient volunteers were able to return to full-time service at Cascade Hospice residence and provide comfort care for 233 people. We were able to facilitate Basic Hospice Training for the first time in a few years which 14 caring community members successfully completed.

Fundraising events returned to the Chilliwack Hospice Society calendar in a big way with our 17th Annual Gala: *Swingin' on a Star* and the 10th Annual Hometown Hoedown for Hospice, both of which raise significant funds to help support our bereavement and palliative care support programs.

Community outreach also returned to normal with our annual Memorial Celebration, Celebrate A Life, and a new Health and Wellness Day Open House. Free educational workshops and presentations varied from estate planning to household organization, to journal-making, pour-painting, and advance care planning. Following the purchase of a new television for our main programming space, we also hosted movie matinées for group viewing of thought-provoking films and discussion. Our Supportive Walking Group continues to meet weekly and invite bereaved newcomers to join them on their walk around Sardis Park, and a new supportive group is meeting weekly for gentle chair yoga.

Chilliwack Hospice Society, as a member of Federation of Fraser Region Hospice Societies, contributed to hosting and facilitating the inaugural Hospice Education Days conference, October 27–28, in partnership with the BC Hospice Palliative Care Association and their Vancouver Island counterparts.

Our Child & Youth Program continues to grow and develop through in-school supports, one-to-one and group programming, and family-oriented art and movie nights. Our annual Horse Whisperer Grief Camp welcomed 24 bereaved children to experience the healing energy of being with horses. Our Teen Grief Peer Support Training program was successfully completed by 16 local high school students.

Our Thrifty Boutique continues to impress our community providing an award-winning thrifting experience. We are so proud of our staff and volunteers for all the hard work and long hours they put in to process donations, price and inventory saleable items, create beautiful displays, and offer a memorable customer experience — all while representing Chilliwack Hospice Society so well! At least 415 interactions were recorded at the Thrifty Boutique by volunteers providing information about Society programs and services this year.

Chilliwack Hospice Society continues to benefit from funds granted to us by Fraser Health and the Government of British Columbia. All these programs, services, and more wouldn't be possible without the generous support of members, donors, sponsors, and volunteers like you. Thank you for your continued benevolence toward Chilliwack Hospice Society.

As our community continues to grow, so too does our organization. I am so proud of, and grateful for, our incredible staff team. Each of these caring humans have shown tremendous compassion, creativity, and resilience as our organization has faced the challenges brought on by COVID-19. With their leadership and the support of our Board and membership, Chilliwack Hospice Society will continue to innovate and develop programming that meets our grief community where they're at; fulfilling our mission to provide heartfelt support through the most difficult times in the human experience, the dying and grieving process.

Finally, as the 2022/23 fiscal year draws to a close, I would like to honour our amazing, dedicated volunteers. Thank you for your continued support of Chilliwack Hospice Society!




